

June 18, 2026 – Official meeting summary: Minister Halman and NSYCC



On June 18, the Nova Scotia Youth Climate Council (NSYCC) wrapped up its term with a final meeting with the Honourable Tim Halman, Nova Scotia's Minister of Environment and Climate Change.

Council members joined both virtually and in-person to share their perspectives and recommendations on the following question:

- *In a renewed Climate Plan, how can government expand on existing actions to further support skills building for the clean economy?*

During the meeting, the council members:

- Highlighted opportunities to create additional climate change coordinator positions at large organizations.
- Recommended resources to support youth experiencing climate anxiety.
- Emphasized the importance of providing clear guidance and training programs for updated building codes.

- Proposed ways to better integrate Indigenous perspectives into the provincial Climate Change Action Plan and highlighted the importance of sharing them with decision-makers, teachers and the public.
- Suggested adding education for trades to the climate plan and provincial curricula to help address labour shortages.
- Encouraged the province to prioritize clean fuels like green hydrogen and battery technology over renewable natural gas and biomass.
- Called for stronger investment in post-secondary education.
